

The Department of Music Performance Studies, Don Wright Faculty of Music, Western University, invites applications for a full-time, probationary (tenure-track) appointment in Trombone at the rank of Assistant Professor. The salary will be commensurate with the successful applicant's qualifications and experience. The anticipated start date will be July 1, 2022.

An earned doctorate or professional equivalent is required. The successful candidate will have an established and ongoing career of performance in trombone. In addition, the candidate will demonstrate strong pedagogical skills relevant to students at the undergraduate and graduate levels. Teaching duties will primarily include applied trombone instruction, but may also include other courses at the undergraduate, master's or doctoral level. Additional teaching assignments will be determined by the candidate's expertise and could include (but not be limited to) topics such as jazz studies, improvisation practices, pedagogy, early music performance, topics related to current music industry practice and technology, performance arts health and wellness, or other performance topics outside the western classical idiom. The successful candidate will be expected to recruit outstanding students nationally and internationally. Service and administrative duties will also be expected at the department, faculty, and university levels.

The Don Wright Faculty of Music, with approximately 440 undergraduate and 160 graduate students, is one of the largest music schools in Canada and supports a wide range of studies in performance, music education, composition, history and theory, and popular music.
